Before administering this survey, consider leading a brief discussion with your students about your course being taught in English and about the purpose of the survey—that it is for you to gain important information about their experiences in order to best teach the class. Explaining to students the purpose of this survey will encourage them to think carefully about their responses and share useful information.

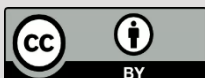
